From the Principal

Below is the speech delivered by Mr Kelly at the Secondary Awards Assembly last week:

<u>Principals Reflections Manilla Good Start Assembly</u> – 28th March 2024

Welcome everyone to our Term 1 Awards Assembly this morning. Standing up here the uniform looks great, well done on that.

I've been told it is part of the tradition of this assembly that the principal gives a reflection on how first term has gone. I'm pleased to have this opportunity as it got me to stop and pause on what my impressions have been of Manilla Central School after being here for a nearly a term as Principal.

What stood out to me from the start, even when I did my visit term 4 last year, was how polite and friendly you people as students are. And I've got a few takes on this. Personally, I've felt welcomed by the large majority of students, but what also has struck me is the positive relationships that exist between you people as peers.

In larger schools it is not common for multiple year groups and students of different ages to associate, but it is quite common place here and adds to the friendly nature of the school. And I would probably have to go back to my first appointment as a teacher to the small town of Nyngan in the middle of the state to have worked in a school with such positive relationships between staff and students.

Another thing that struck me early on was the facilities and how well equipped the school is. A lot of technology, the hospitality kitchen, the metal work room, the Ag plot. There are facilities here that bigger schools would be envious over. This gives you people great opportunities in your learning and future career pathways.

There is also a culture of learning here, and this isn't something that has occurred by accident. The work the staff have done in developing a culture and building the skills of the student body in relation to literacy, particularly writing skills, is evident. I was so impressed the morning of

the cold write, you could have heard a pin drop as I walked around the school that morning and all classes were head down doing their best at the task. This fed into students giving NAPLAN their best shot, as they had the skills and focus to take the assessment on. We are going to launch into a numeracy program next term with a similar format, I would encourage you all to apply yourself to this as well, just about every job requires being able to do Maths and have numeracy skills.

As the new Principal I looked at the data relating to results here before I started. I could see an improvement in HSC results over the past 4 years and can see why.

Finally, the highlight day for me so far was Harmony Day. To see the interaction of the whole school from K-12 was something I hadn't seen before and was great to see.

Overall reflection, there is a culture of students having a go and doing their best in a caring environment. This is something I am determined for us to continue to build on. A message you will hear from me often, it is about doing your personal best and getting the most out of the opportunities on offer here. What's in the school motto, to strive and to achieve.

I put it to all of you to give your personal best and do that.

There are many wonderful prizes students can earn through their individual fundraising. There are only a few days left to get your donations in!


Our Slime Run will be on this

Drink: Water and/or reduced fat plain milk

Fundamental Movement Skills Activity: Balancing Act

Fundamental Movement Skills (FMS) are the building blocks of movement. Just like kids need to learn to read and write, they need to learn how to master FMS for a lifetime of enjoying being physically active.

Try the activity 'Balancing Act' to develop balance!

Students try balancing different objects to see which shapes are easiest to balance.

What you need:

Various balancing objects, such as feathers, shoes, caps, broom handles, balancing poles (made from rolled up newspaper and sticky tape), etc.

What to do:

- Students balance various objects to see which shapes are easiest to balance
- Students use different body parts to balance the objects, such as the palm or back of their hand, or their knee, foot, elbow or chin

Change it up:

- Students try walking or lying down and getting back up again while trying to balance the object
- Students 'jump' the balancing object from one body part to another i.e., one hand to another
- Compete with others and see who can hold a balance the longest




