#### **TASK DESCRIPTION**

Task: Creative Task - Narrative and Visual Representation

**Description:** 

You are to compose a narrative based on the themes explored in the text you have studied in class.

Your narrative should include at least one of the following themes:

- Relationships
- Survival
- Resourcefulness
- Empathy

#### Your narrative should include:

- A clear orientation, plot, and conclusion (beginning, middle, end)
- Descriptive language
- Language forms and features such as simile, metaphor, and imagery
- A clear exploration of at least one of the above themes

#### Part B - Visual Representation (10 Marks)

#### Size: A4

Along with your narrative, you are to use software such as Canva, Publisher or PowerPoint to submit a **book cover** for *your own narrative (Part A)* that captures the themes of your piece.

Your book cover should include:

- A title
- Images linked to your themes
- Colour
- A short blurb explaining the content of your story

You will be assessed on how well your cover links to the themes you have explored in the text, and on how you use technology effectively to create a visually appealing product.
