

	Minor Behaviours								
Inappropriate Language	Messages or use of words in an inappropriate way for the developmental age of t student (i.e. name calling, teasing).								
Physical Contact	Non-serious, but inappropriate physical contact (i.e. over-affectionate, patting, light tapping, etc.).								
Non-compliance	Defiance / Disrespect / Non-Compliance Low-intensity failure to respond to adult requests (i.e. yelling, "no!" when asked to a something).								
Mild Disruption	Talking while teacher is speaking. Loud voices or noises indoors.								
Property Misuse	Student deliberately destroys another student's equipment/possession or work in an inappropriate way (low-intensity incident) i.e. scribbles on another student's page, snaps another student's pencil through rough handling.								
Dress Code Violation	Student wears clothing or shoes that do not fit within the school setting policies.								
Late to Class	Missing the beginning of class time.								
Fractional Truancy	Missing whole lessons or part lessons.								
Cheating	Act dishonestly or unfairly in order to gain an advantage, esp. in a game or examination.								
Other	Other minor problem behaviour that cannot be categorised within the available definitions. E.g. Out of bounds (refer to Major Behaviour: Absconding for more serious breaches); Smoking (possession of tobacco for minors is not illegal – only supply, therefore do not select Major Behaviour: Criminal behaviour).								
Major Behaviours									
Abusive Language	Abusive Language / Inappropriate Language / Profanity Messages that include swearing, name calling or use of words in an inappropriate way for the developmental age of the child.								
Physical Aggression	Actions involving serious physical contact where injury may occur (i.e. hitting, punching, hitting with an object, kicking, hair pulling, scratching, etc.)								
Continued Defiance	Continued Disrespect/Non-Compliance Refusal to follow directions, talking back and/or socially rude interactions. In this case the student refuses to follow directions after initial request has been made directly to that student.								
Continued Disruption	Continued behaviour causing an interruption in a class or activity. Disruption includes sustained loud talk, yelling or screaming; noise with materials; horseplay or roughhousing, and/or sustained out-of-seat behaviour (i.e. tantrums, excessive yelling or screaming).								
Property Damage	Any form of injury or damage caused to the property, due to negligence or intentionally by the person who is not the owner of the property.								
Harassment	Harassment/ Tease / Taunt - Student delivers disrespectful messages (verbal or gestural) to another person that includes threats and intimidation, obscene gestures, pictures, or written notes. Disrespectful messages include negatives comments based on race, religion gender, age, and / or national origin; sustained or intense verbal attacks based on ethnic origin, disabilities or other personal matters.								
Absconding	Within school grounds or leaving school grounds or attempting to run away; leave suddenly; hide from staff (fence, roof, gates), safety issues.								
Theft	Student is in possession of, having passed on, or being responsible for removing someone else's property (i.e. taking someone else's personal belongings etc.).								
Criminal Behaviour	<ul> <li>Criminal or delinquent behaviour may include but not limited to:</li> <li>Possession or use of a prohibited weapon</li> <li>Making credible threats</li> <li>Stalking and cyber stalking</li> <li>Custody of a knife at school</li> <li>Use of technology to intimidate or harass</li> <li>Harassment and victimisation</li> <li>Criminal Damage</li> <li>Vilification</li> </ul>

### **White Level**

## YELLOW MONITORING CARD

### How you get there:

- Three (3) Sentral Entries
- Commit a serious offence
- •Three classroom monitoring cards in a term

### **Consequences:**

• Teacher will send a letter to notify parents/guardians

- Student will need to complete a Reflection sheet
- Student will miss out on classroom privileges (e.g. games, playground equipment)
- At least one lunchtime detention, more for serious incidents
- Attendance at excursions, camps and performances will be subject to an individual risk assessment whilst on Orange Level
- Student will be excluded from the end of term Reward Time
- If further misbehaviour occurs whilst on Yellow Level, student will be moved onto Orange Card

## **ORANGE MONITORING CARD**

### How you get there:

- Commit an offence whilst on Yellow Card
- Commit a serious offence
- Third Yellow card within a term

#### **Consequences:**

- Supervisor will send a letter to notify parents/guardians
- Parent interview with the Class Teacher and Supervisor
- Student will need to complete a Reflection sheet
- Student will be monitored through a Behaviour Card which needs to

be signed daily by teachers and parents

- Student will miss out on classroom privileges (e.g. games, playground equipment)
- Student will need to complete up to five lunchtime detentions
- Attendance at excursions, camps and performances will be subject to an individual risk assessment whilst on Orange Level
- Student cannot participate in school representative activities whilst on Orange Level (e.g. PSSA,SRC, Football)
- Student will be excluded from the end of term Reward Time
- If further misbehaviour occurs whilst on Orange card, student will be given a Suspension Warning or Suspension

### **RED MONITORING CARD**

### How you get there:

• Return from suspension

### **Consequences:**

- Supervisor will send a letter to notify parents/guardians
- Parent interview with Assistant Principal
- Student will need to complete a Reflection sheet
- Student will be monitored through a Behaviour Card which needs to be signed daily by teachers and parents
- Student will miss out on classroom privileges (e.g. games, playground equipment)
- Student may be placed on a Playground Inclusion Program and a two

day In-School Withdrawal

- Attendance at excursions, camps and performances will be subject to an individual risk assessment
- Student cannot participate in school representative activities whilst on Red Card (e.g. PSSA, SRC, Football)
- Student will be excluded from the end of term Reward Time
- If further misbehaviour occurs, then student will remain on Red Card and the school may consider suspension and ask for outside assistance
