Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

The Year 1 Phonics Screening Check will be administered to all students in Year 1 from this week. This is a quick assessment that tells teachers how your child is progressing in phonics. The assessment includes pseudo or nonsense words to see if students can use their knowledge of blending to read a word rather than their memory of having seen that word before. A parent letter has been sent home with Year 1 students today which has further information.
