Year 8 students are being asked to choose the elective subjects that they wish to study in Year 9 during 2025. In Years 9 and 10 English, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, and Personal Development/Health/Physical Education are compulsory for all students in NSW. Students are able to choose two elective subjects based on their interests or future career options.

When students discuss elective choices within their family, it is important to note that some courses will be more popular and may fill quickly. For this reason, early return of the Subject Selection Form is advised. Priority will be given based on the order of form return and fee payment after confirmation.

There are **compulsory** course fees in some subjects to cover the cost of materials used by students.

- A letter will be given to students in Term 4 to confirm placement in electives.
- Fees will need to be paid before the student will be allowed to start a course with a compulsory fee. Fees can be paid after receiving of subject confirmation letter and school invoice.
- Parents are encouraged to pay any compulsory fees during December. Otherwise, payment can be made in 2025.
- Fees may be paid on the first day of school in 2025 but a position in the course cannot be guaranteed as the course may already be full.
- Fees may be "paid off" in small amounts starting immediately if parents wish. It is expected that parents will plan to have fees paid on time. As parents have been given adequate warning of compulsory fees, it is expected that parents would only approach the Principal for a variation of the above in the most exceptional of circumstances.
- The fees will cover the course for Year 9 only.
- If students select an elective with a compulsory fee and it is not paid, students will be placed in an elective course which does not have a compulsory fee.
- If a student pays an elective fee and does not start that elective the fee will be refunded in full.
- If a student leaves the school or changes elective part way through the year, the unused portion of the fee will be refunded on a pro rata basis.
- There are mandatory uniform requirements for some electives, ie the wearing of leather shoes. These subjects are indicated later in the document. Students who do not comply with this requirement may not be able to select and/or continue with the study of these electives.

Attached for your information are the elective choices for 2025. Students are urged to seek advice from parents and teachers to ensure they are as fully informed as possible.

ELECTIVE COURSES

YEAR 9 - 2025

AGRICULTURAL TECHNOLOGY - Mandatory WHS leather shoes required.

The study of Agricultural Technology provides students with opportunities to experience aspects of an agricultural lifestyle through direct contact with plants and animals. The study of a variety of enterprises allows students to make responsible decisions about the appropriate use of agricultural technologies.

Students explore career opportunities in agriculture and related service industries and investigate the viability of Australian agriculture through management of issues relating to the sustainability of agricultural systems, as well as the relationships between production, processing and consumption.

VISUAL ARTS - Mandatory WHS leather shoes required.

There is a compulsory fee of \$60.

Visual Arts provides opportunities for students to enjoy the making and studying of art. It builds an understanding of the role of art in all forms of media, both in the contemporary and historical world, and enables students to represent their ideas and interests in artworks. Visual Arts enables students to become informed about, understand and write about their contemporary world.

Students learn to investigate and respond to a wide range of artists and artworks in artmaking, critical and historical studies. They also learn to interpret and explain the function of and relationships in the artworld between the artist – artwork – world – audience to make and study artworks.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES AND SPORT STUDIES

Physical Activity and Sports Studies aims to enhance students' capacity to participate effectively in physical activity and sport, leading to improved quality of life for themselves and others.

Students engage in a wide range of physical activities in order to develop key understandings about how and why we move and how to enhance quality and enjoyment of movement.

The course includes modules selected from each of the following three areas of study:

- Foundations of Physical Activity
- Physical Activity and Sport in Society
- Enhancing Participation and Performance

INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY – Mandatory WHS leather shoes required.

There is a compulsory fee of \$60.

The study of Industrial Technology provides students with opportunities to engage in a diverse range of creative and practical experiences using a variety of technologies widely available in industrial and domestic settings. This may include study in the focus areas of:

- Metal
- Timber.

They develop knowledge and understanding of materials and processes. Related knowledge and skills are developed through a specialised approach to the tools, materials, equipment and techniques employed in the planning, development, construction and evaluation of quality practical projects and processes. Critical thinking skills are developed through engagement with creative practical problem-solving activities.

FOOD TECHNOLOGY - Mandatory WHS leather shoes required.

There is a compulsory fee of \$60.

The study of Food Technology provides students with a broad knowledge of food properties, processing, preparation, nutritional considerations and consumption patterns. It addresses the importance of hygiene, safe working practices and legislation in relation to the production of food. Students develop food-specific skills, which can be applied in a range of contexts enabling students to produce quality food products. The course also provides students with contexts through which to explore the richness, pleasure and variety food adds to life and how it contributes to both vocational and general life experiences.
