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
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
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
Read the words in the unicorn and draw a picture for each word in the space below. You might like to cut out pictures of the words from a magazine and paste them into the squares instead.





I can play chess.









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
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
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That fish can jump.



The dish has a chip.











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
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Help the leprechaun find his pot of gold at the end of the maze. Make sure you read each word as you move through the maze.
